## Pupil Premium 2014 -2015

Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. It is aimed at raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and closing the gap with their peers.

The Department of Education 2014-2015 categorises pupils as: Disadvantaged pupils:

- ❖ Pupils in Year Groups R to 6 recorded as Ever 6 FSM this means those pupils recorded on the January 2014 School Census who were recorded as known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM)
- Looked After Children (LAC)
- Children adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002

#### Statement of intent:

- ♣ To ensure that there is a good climate for learning and ALL pupils can succeed
- ♣ To monitor the progress of pupils subject to pupil premium in English, Mathematics and performance across the curriculum
- ♣ To support pupils attitudes to learning and behaviour and ensure that the school reduces pupils barriers to learning by focused intervention
- ♣ Increase the maximum time for learning by improving attendance and punctuality, and extending learning time for some pupils
- ♣ Enhance parental engagement, developing opportunities to help their child/children, also support for vulnerable families in the community
- Subsidise activity to ensure families access enrichment opportunity to develop social, emotional, and cultural opportunities
- ♣ One to one tuition for identified learners to ensure progress is in line with school and National expectation

## 2. Summary of PPG Spending 2014/15

### Objectives in spending PPG:

- Accelerate rates of progress in reading, writing and particularly mathematics for PPG eligible children so they achieve national expectations or above by the time they leave St. Jude's.
- Continued support for learners whose performance is below their peers particularly in English and Mathematics
- Pupils have opportunities for Enrichment activity and extended school activity is also subsidised
- Targeted pupils for booster tuition
- Additional support for pupils who are EAL and Pupil Premium developing a language rich programme

- Tracking and analysis of pupil performance three times a term
- Professional discussion about the progress of learners in class/year groups
- ❖ Pastoral leader to work directly with parent/carers vulnerable families
- ❖ Additional support from teaching assistants to support learning- each class has one extra support member of staff and target classes have two
- Funding of resources to deliver group intervention
- ❖ Development of a Early Language skills to target early English
- INSET and Staff development to ensure ALL pupils needs are met
