## Autumn is looking exciting in Year 4!

### Literacy

In Literacy, Year 4 will be starting this term reading Percy Jackson and The Lightning Thief by Rick Riordan. We will also be exploring Greek Myths and non-fiction writing. In Autumn 2, we will be reading The Wreck of the Zanzibar and Matilda! We will be writing for a range of different purposes.

### ON Numeracy

In Numeracy, we will be working on all aspects of mathematics. This will include the core skills of addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. We will also be looking at number problems and fractions. It is important children to practise recalling multiplication facts as they must know these by the end of this year.

### History

In History, children will be learning about the Ancient Greeks. We will be looking at this ancient civilisation with a particular focus on the Ancient Greek lifestyle and how some of their discoveries and their way of life still influence us today.

### Geography

Within Geography, we will be learning about Rivers. Children will have the opportunity to learn the features and journey of a river. We will be locating major rivers in the United Kingdom and in different continents.

### Science

In our Science topic, Year 4 will be studying States of Matter. We will be investigating solids, liquids and gases. Children will be learning how they can change the state of water and the water cycle.

In addition to this, Living things, including humans, will be covered. Areas such as the human digestive system, food chains and types of teeth will be explored in detail.



### R.E

In Religious Education, we will be looking at the significant leaders in Sikhism and Hinduism and how they are inspiring. In the run up to Christmas children will explore the Holy Trinity in order to understand the significance of the Father, the Sun and the Holy Spirit.

## Art & D.T

In Art, we will be focusing on an artist called William Morris. We will be exploring his artwork and using his work to inspire us to create our own in his style.

In DT our topic is moving vehicles. This will enable us to study how vehicles are constructed and design and make our own vehicle, thinking about how our designs can make the vehicle travel further.
