English

In Year 5 we will be reading, 'The Selfish Giant' by Oscar Wilde, C.S Lewis' The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl.

We will also be exploring some non-fiction texts about the Maya and a Mayan folktale.

Mathematics

We will recap and consolidate our knowledge of place value and the four operations, measure angles accurately and develop our knowledge of fractions to solve more complex problems.

It is important for your child to practise their times tables up to 12x and their mental maths.

Science

In Science, Year 5 we will recap states of matter before studying properties of materials and changes in materials.

Geography

We will explore how products are transported across trade routes around the world, having positive and negative impacts on our daily lives.

Children will learning about how to create spreadsheets, games and use databases.

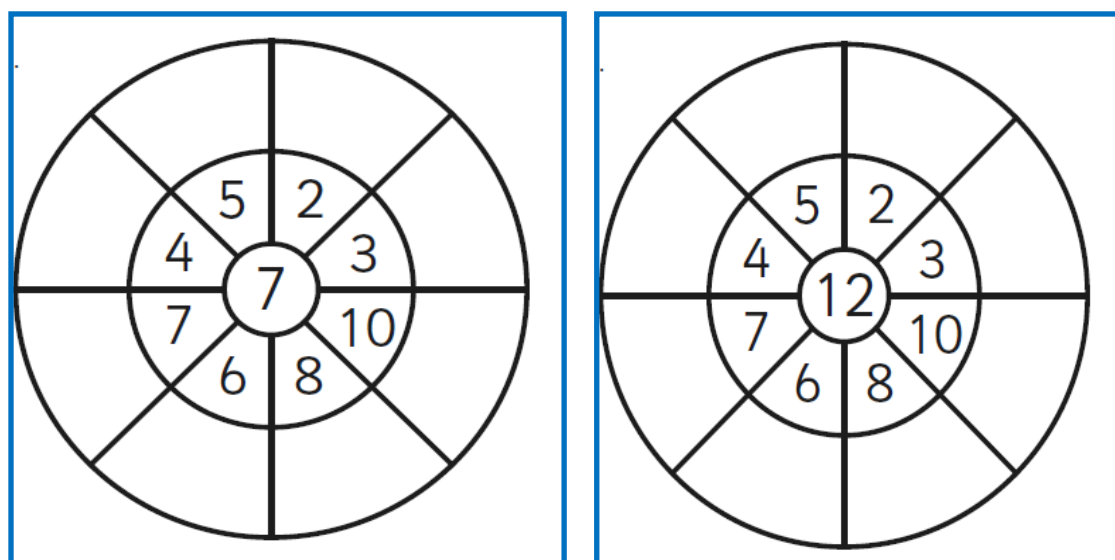
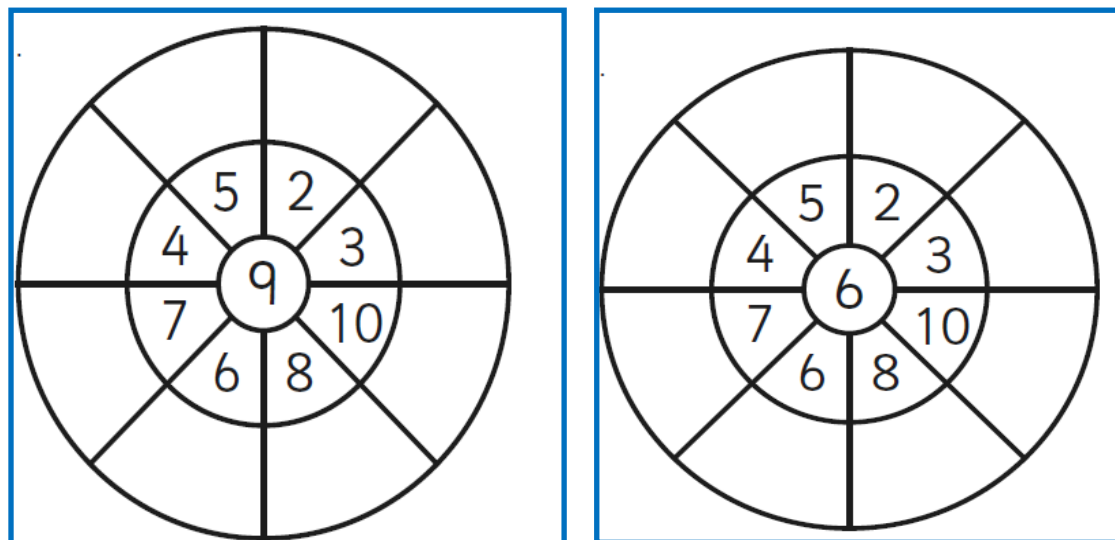
