
Year 3 Summer 2023



<u>Science</u>

Across the Summer Term, our topic is Plants including

roots and shoots, and fruits and seeds. We will be looking at the functions of a plant, how much space they need to grow and the part of the plant we can eat whilst completing a range of investigations. We will take part in an investigation to identify how seeds are dispersed and what makes then travel.

<u> Well-Being</u>

In Well-Being this term the children will be identifying the relationships they have with key individuals in their life, before thinking about how life will be changing as we move up the school. We will also look at targets and goals.

Literacy

In Year 3 we will be writing a range of nonfiction pieces linked to our texts including: a diary entry, a letter, persuasive posters and more. Our literacy texts for the term include Cliffhanger, the Tunnel, Leon and the Place Between, and Revolting Rhymes.

<u> Topic: History</u>

In History our topic is 'Adventurers and Famous People'. We will be focusing on explorers such as Blackbeard, Mary Kingsley and discussing who made it to the North Pole and Mount Everest first!



Computing

We use Purple Mash for our computing skills. Children will complete a module on E-Safety. We will complete schemes of work involving databases, graphing and presenting.



<u>Mathematics</u>

During our Mathematics lessons we are going o to build on our calculation skills, learning different written methods. We will explore, in greater depth place value, addition and subtraction, 2D and 3D shapes, fractions and volume. Children will continue to apply their knowledge to a range of problems and solve reasoning style problems in more depth.



In Geography this term we are looking at the Wonders of the World. This will include the ancient, natural and new wonders and exploring where they are, how they remain where they are and their significance


Art and D.T


