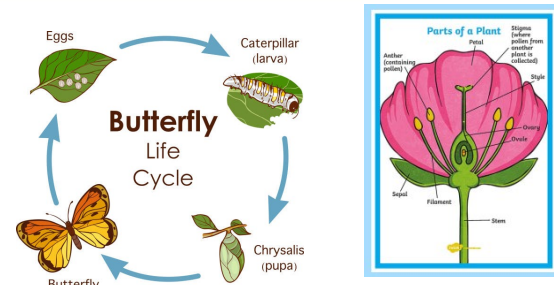


# Year 5 Summer 2023



## Science

In Science, we will be exploring the lifecycles of plants and animals, including how we as human beings change and grow.

## History

In History, we will be learning about intrepid explorers, such as Sacagawea and Leif Eriksson.

## English



In Year 5 we will be reading, Can you see me?, Stig of the Dump, Shakespeare's 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' and 'Aquila'.

We will be using these texts to write and perform play scripts, explanation texts, balanced arguments and narratives.

## Geography

In Geography, our topic is North America. We will explore the countries and landscape of North America, including the climate, landmarks and other geographical features that can be found.



## Well Being

This term we will be learning about relationships, in particular how to be a good friend. We will also be doing transition work to prepare for Year 6.

## Mathematics

We will recap and consolidate our knowledge of place value and the four operations, explore shape and measurement, and develop our knowledge of percentages, decimals and fractions to solve more complex problems. It is important for your child to practise their times tables up to 12x and their mental maths.

## Spanish

Children will continue to learn both written and conversational Spanish this term.

## Computing

Children will learn about 3D modelling, concept maps and word processing in their computing lessons this term.

On P.E. days children can come to school in P.E. kit / sportswear and will stay in it all day.

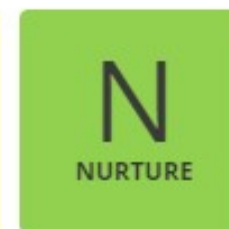
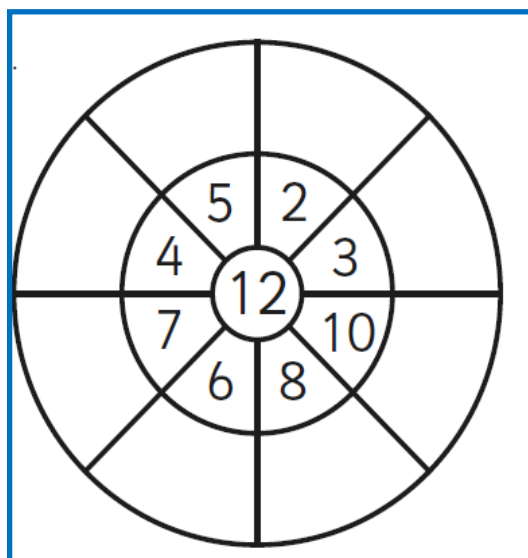
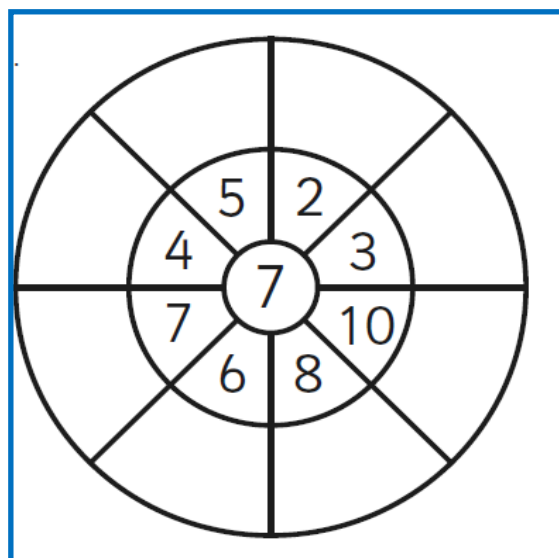
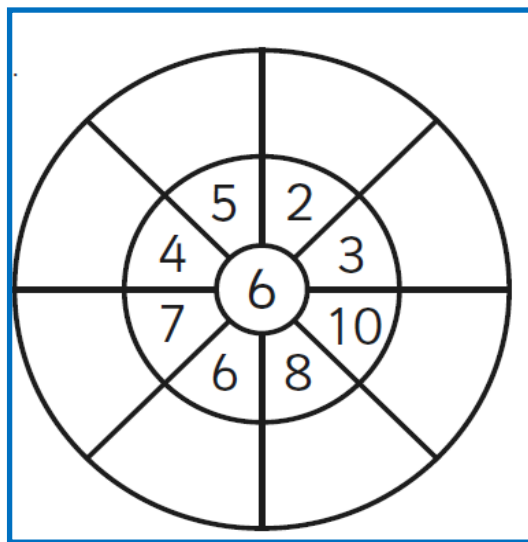
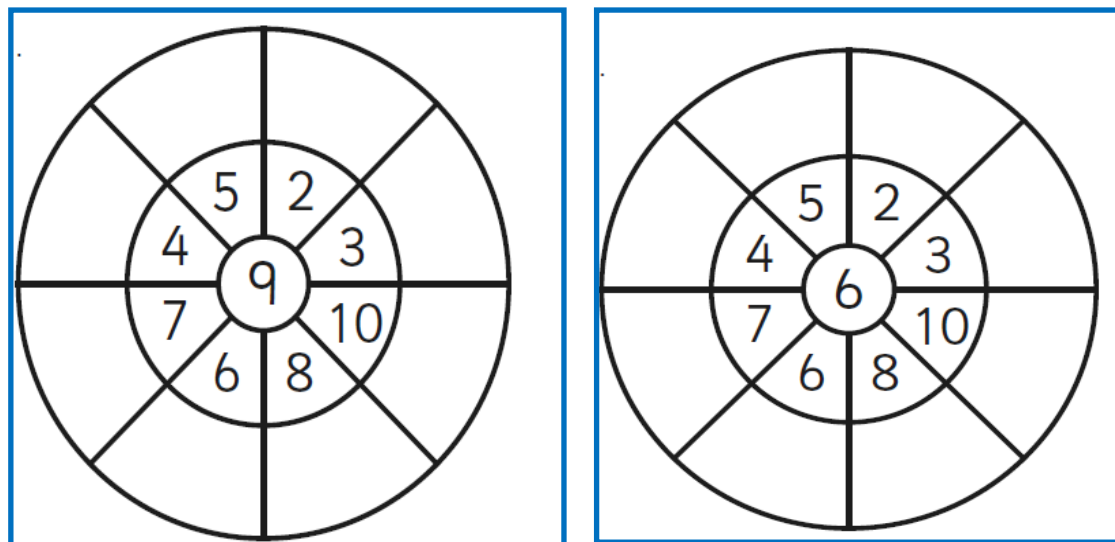
## Art/D.T
