In History, children will be learning about the Industrial Revolution. Children will learn about the different events that occurred during the Industrial Revolution and the impact this period of time had on England, and our local area. Geography

Within Geography, we will be exploring our local area in more detail. Children will use skills such as mapping, digital mapping and focus upon human and physical features of our local area. Children will use technology to explore Wolverhampton in more detail.

Notices

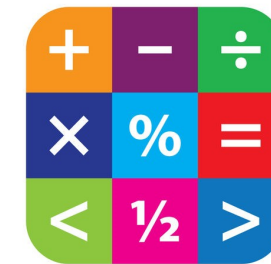

Literacy

In Literacy, Year 4 will be starting this term with Hansel & Gretel by Anthony Browne. We will also be reading the text Sam Wu is Not Afraid of the Dark. In Spring 2, we will be reading Cloud Busting, Non-fiction texts that relate to our topic of the Industrial Revolution and Rudyard Kipling: 'Just So' Stories! We will be writing for a range of different purposes.

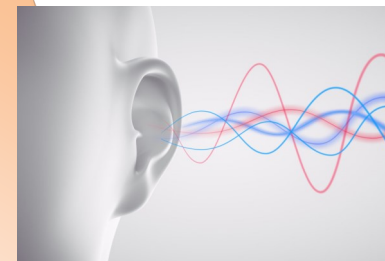


Numeracy

In Numeracy will be working on all aspects of mathematics, including number, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and fractions. It is important that your child continues to practise recalling multiplication facts as they must know these by the end of this year.

Science

In our Science topic, Year 4 will be studying Sound. We will be investigating 'What is sound?' 'How do our ears work?' and 'What is the difference between Pitch and Volume?'



In addition to this, Living things and their habitats will be covered. Areas such as the animal groups, classification and MRS NERG will be explored in detail.

R.E



In Religious Education, we will be looking at What is it like to follow God? Following this, children will explore Why do Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday? This will involve children understanding why the Last Supper was important and exploring the Easter Story in more detail.



Art & D.T

In Art, we will be focusing on an artist called Georgia O'Keeffe. We will be exploring her artwork and using her work to inspire us to create our own in her style.



In DT, our topic is juggling balls. This will enable us to design, create and test whether weight alters the performance of a juggling ball.



Reading

All children are provided with a school reading book and reading record. We expect both of these to be in school every day. This is so we can hear the children read both individually and through guided reading sessions. Children are encouraged to read as much as possible and we would ask that they are heard at home so they develop a love of reading.

Computing

In Computing we will be focusing on Computer skills. We will be learning how to use different functions on Microsoft word. In addition, children will learn about animation and how this has developed over many years.
