Literacy

In Year 3 we will be writing a range of pieces linked to our texts including different writing outcomes. We will also be writing a recount of our school trip to Conkers! Our literacy texts for the term include BFG and Our Tower,

Science



Across the Summer Term, our topic is Plants. This will

include exploring roots and shoots, and fruits and seeds. We will be looking at the functions of a plant, investigating what they need to grow and the parts of the plant we can eat. We will explore seed dispersal and what causes them to travel.

<u>Wellbeing</u>

In Wellbeing this term the children will be thinking about how they can manage their personal wellbeing, such as with a healthy diet and exercising. We will also be thinking about economic wellbeing.

History

In History our topic is 'Adventurers and Famous People'. We will be focusing on explorers such as Blackbeard, Mary Kingsley and discussing who made it to the North Pole and Mount Everest first!

Mathematics

During our Mathematics lessons we are going to build on our calculation skills, strengthening our written methods and developing our estimation skills. We will explore number, 2D and 3D shapes, fractions and volume. Children will continue to apply their knowledge to a range of problems and solve reasoning style problems in more depth.

In Year 3 we will be having P.E on: Tuesdays and Fridays.


Children are asked to come to school dressed in their P.E kit and will remain in it for the rest of the school day.
