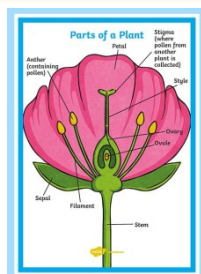
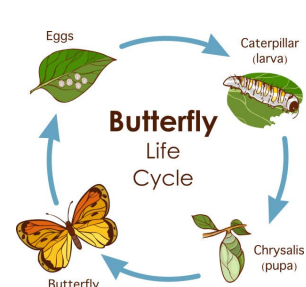


Year 5 Summer 2025



English



In Year 5 we will be reading, *Granny* by Anthony Horowitz, *Can You See Me* by Libby Scott and we will be using the non-fiction *Everest* by Alexandra Stewart to engage and support our writing in our Literacy lessons.

Mathematics

We will recap and consolidate our knowledge of place value and the four operations, explore shape and measurement, and develop our knowledge of percentages, decimals and fractions to solve more complex problems. It is important for your child to practise their times tables up to 12x and their mental maths.

Science

In Science, we will be exploring the lifecycles of plants and animals, including how we as human beings change and grow.

Geography

In Geography, our topic is North America. We will explore the countries and landscape of North America, including the climate, landmarks and other geographical features that can be found.

Computing

In Computing, we will be focusing on databases, game creator and online safety.

Spanish

Children will continue to learn both written and conversational Spanish this term.

History

In History, we will be learning about intrepid explorers, such as Sacagawea and Leif Eriksson.

On P.E. days children can come to school in P.E. kit / sportswear and will stay in it all day.

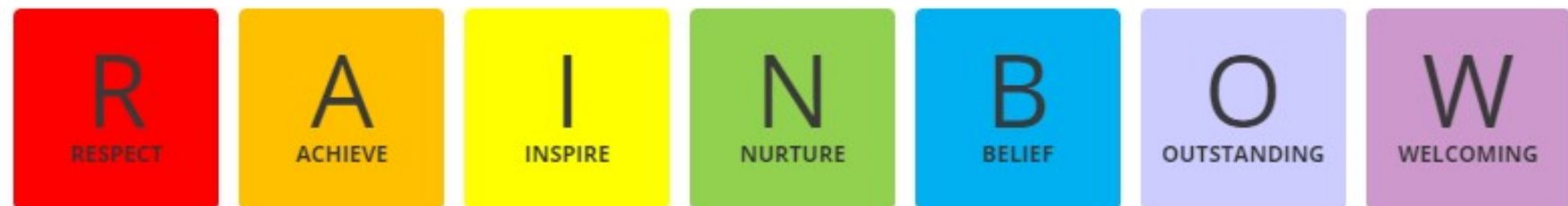
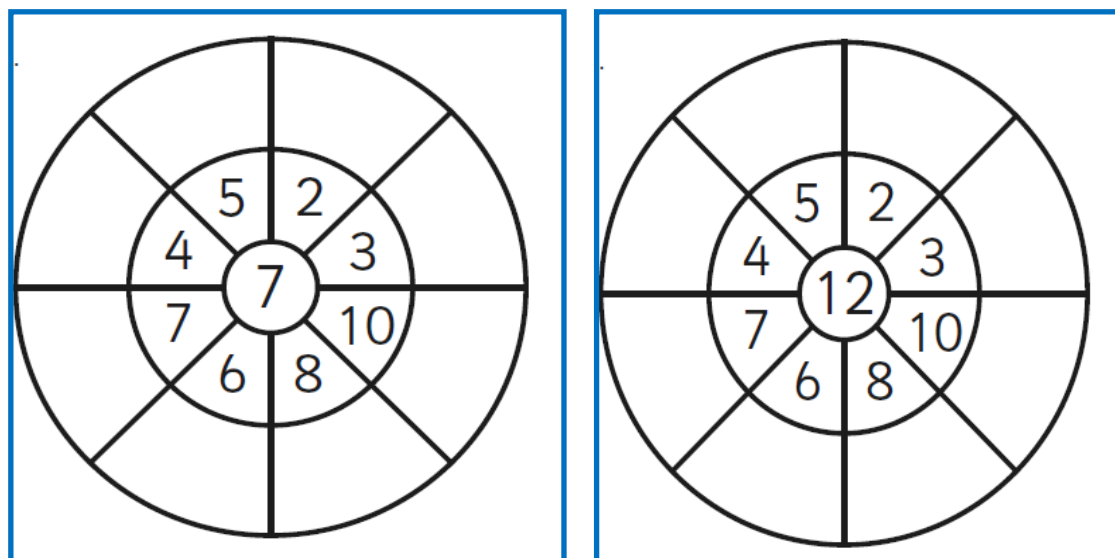
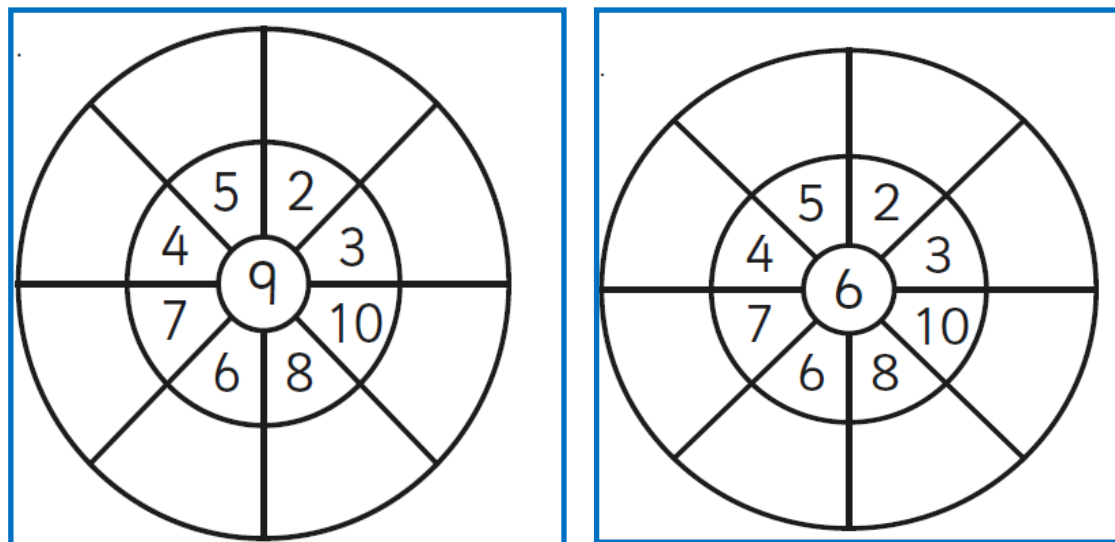
