History

In History, children will be learning about the Industrial Revolution. Children will learn about the different events that occurred during the Industrial Revolution and the impact this period of time had on England, and our local area. Children will also look at how life for children was different to the lives they live today.



Geography

Within Geography, we will be exploring our local area in more detail. Children will use skills such as mapping, digital mapping and focus upon human and physical features of our local area. Children will use technology to explore Wolverhampton in more detail.

Literacy

In Literacy, Year 4 will be starting this term with Sam Wu is NOT afraid of the dark by Katie and Kevin Tsang. We will also be reading The Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman and will be focusing on building tension through dialogue. Other texts include Fox by Margaret Wild, How the Stars Came to Be by Poonam Mistry and Let's Chase Stars Together by Matt Goodfellow. We will be writing for a range of different purposes.



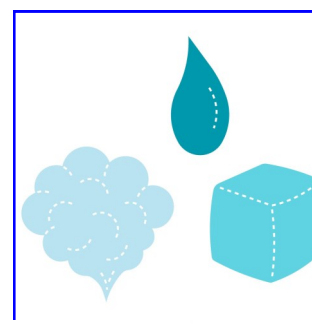
Remember to practise your reading, handwriting and times tables.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, we will be working on all aspects of mathematics, including number, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and fractions. It is important that your child continues to practise recalling multiplication facts as they must know these by the end of this year.

Science

In our Science topic Year 4 will be studying States of Matter. We will be investigating solids, liquids and gases. Children will be learning how they can change the state of water and the water cycle.



In addition to this, Living things, including humans, will be covered. Areas such as the human digestive system, food chains and types of teeth will be explored in detail.

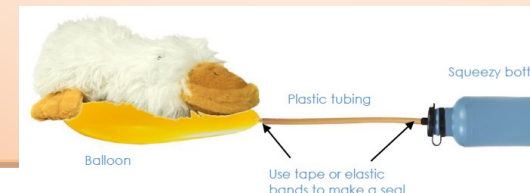
In Religious Education, we will be looking at the significant leaders in Hinduism and how they are inspiring. In the run up to Christmas children will explore the Holy Trinity in order to understand the significance of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.



Art & D.T

In Art, we will be focusing on an artist called William Morris. We will be exploring his artwork and using his work to inspire us to create our own in his style.

In DT, our topic is mechanical systems. We will be looking at how we can make things move through design, assembly and evaluation.



Reading

All children are provided with a school reading book and reading record, alongside an online book on Bug club. We expect both of these to be in school every day. This is so we can hear the children read both individually and through guided reading sessions. Children are encouraged to read as much as possible and we would ask that they are heard at home so they develop a love of reading.

Computing

In Computing we will be focusing on E-Safety and coding. We will be learning how to use a search engine, how to create a safe online account and how to be a responsible digital citizen. During coding children will learn how to make their own game.
